Quality

A fairly useful selection of Westerns continued to be on offer. Nuwara Eliyas were irregular though reasonably mainatined, whilst the Uva/Uda Pussellawas and Low Growns were similar to last.

COMMENTS

Auction offerings declined further this week and totalled 5.0 M/Kgs. There was good general demand.

Ex-Estate offerings were reasonably maintained and totalled 0.84 M/Kgs. A fairly useful selection of teas were on offer from the Western slopes, whilst teas from the Eastern sector showed no change. Nuwara Eliyas' too were reasonably maintained.

Best Western BOP/BOPF's gained by Rs. 100 per kg and substantially more following quality/special inquiry, whilst the others were irregular. In the Below Best category, select improved BOP's appreciated by Rs. 50 per kg and more, whilst the others were irregular and easier. Corresponding BOPF's, whilst select invoices gained by Rs. 100 per kg and more, others were firm and dearer to a lesser extent resulting in consecutive invoices recording sharp price variances. At the lower end, BOP's particularly the Plainer sorts declined by Rs. 50 per kg and more with many withdrawals due to a lack of suitable bids. Corresponding BOPF's - Clean leaf coloury sorts gained by Rs. 20 per kg on average, whilst the others sold around last week's levels. Nuwara Eliya - BOP's were irregular and easier, whilst the corresponding BOPF's in comparison sold well. Uva/Uda Pussellawa BOP's declined by Rs. 50 per kg and more, whilst the corresponding BOPF's declined by Rs. 20-40 per kg.

A salient feature would be the price parity between the BOP and BOPF grades, particularly for teas in the Below Best and Plainer categories which recorded a Rs. 200 per kg plus premium in favour of the latter.

High & Mid Grown CTC teas - BP1's were irregular, whilst the PF1's commenced firm and declined by Rs. 20-40 per kg and more towards the close. Corresponding Low Growns mostly sold around last week's levels.

Amidst attractive prices Somerset Estate recorded a price of Rs. 3,050 per kg for a BOP grade bettering its own previous record of Rs. 2,600 per kg established in the year 2022. The BOPF and PEK grades recorded the highest prices at the sale of Rs. 1,950 and Rs. 2,000 per kg respectively. Somerset Estate situated in Nanu Oya is renowned for its fine quality Ceylon Teas and is managed by Talawakelle Tea Estates PLC (a member of the Hayley Group).

Low Growns comprised of 2.1 M/Kgs and met with fair demand.

In the Leafy and Semi-Leafy catalogues, Select Best and Best BOP1's were firm, whilst the balance together with the bolder varieties were lower. Well-made OP1's sold around last levels, whilst the balance were firm to dearer. High-priced OP's were easier, whilst the balance together with the smaller varieties appreciated. Well-made OPA's were firm, whilst the balance appreciated. High-priced PEK's were firm, whilst the Best and Below Best together with the mixed/open varieties were lower. Teas at the bottom were firm on last. Select Best PEK1's were firm, whilst the balance appreciated.

In the Tippy catalogue, Select Best FBOP's were firm, whilst the Best and Below Best together with the bolder varieties were easier. Teas at the bottom were firm. Select Best FF1's were firm, whilst the Best and cleaner Below Best were firm to dearer. Balance were irregular.

In the Premium catalogue, Very Tippy teas met with good demand and were dearer. The Best and Below Best too appreciated, whilst the teas at the bottom sold around last levels.

World Tea News

Taiwan Orange Tea

More than 15 years after launching the 'Red Oolong Tea' processing method 2008. major in breakthrough on new tea a processing method for 'Taiwanese Orange Tea' has been made. The tea produced through this method is named not for any particular ingredient, but for the orange color of the brew.

Tea varieties such as Chin-Shin-Ganzai, Camellia, and Taiwan tea numbers 17 through 20 and 23 can now be made into Taiwanese Orange Tea products. characteristic common to all tea products that undergo Taiwanese Orange Tea processing is a woody aroma similar to pine. Orange teas processed from tea number 23 and Camellia are fruitier and sweeter, while tea number 18 produces orange tea with a refreshing scent and spicy flavor.

Not only are the products high quality, but the cost of production is low, making it highly competitive in the domestic hand-shaken beverage market. Orange tea can be sold at NT \$200-300 (US \$6-10) per kilogram, on par with imported commercial teas.

Uganda surpasses \$ 1 for tea

Uganda's tea prices at the Mombasa Tea Auction have seen a significant improvement, surpassing the US\$ 1 mark. The average price has risen to US\$1.14 per kilogram, providing hope for the country's tea industry, which has struggled with prolonged low prices.

Many tea factories have yet to adjust farm-gate prices for green-leaf tea, leaving farmers with only marginal increases. By the end of 2024, some regions saw price adjustments of just Sh50 per kilogram, which remains insufficient given production costs.

Improving quality of Ugandan tea is gaining recognition in the global market, a

factor contributing to the price recovery. Uganda's tea prices hit an all-time low of US\$0.66 per kilogram in 2023 before climbing to US\$0.85 per kilogram by the end of 2024.

The latest auction (sale 05 of 2025) reflects a more stable market outlook. Despite this progress, Uganda still trails regional competitors. Kenyan tea averages US\$2.18 per kilogram, while Rwanda's premium teas command approximately US\$2.92 per kilogram.

Teas at the lower end of the market and particularly the Plainer sorts declined by Rs. 50 per kg and more and were often unsold. Nuwara Eliya's were irregular and tended easier. Uva/Uda Pussellawa's declined by Rs. 50 per kg and more.

BOPF

Best Western's - A selection of teas gained by up to Rs. 100 per kg and more following quality/special inquiry, whilst the others were firm and dearer to a lesser extent. In the Below Best category, select improved teas gained by Rs. 100 per kg and more, whilst the others were firm and dearer to a lesser extent. At the lower end of the market, clean leaf coloury sorts gained by Rs. 20 per kg on average, whilst the others sold around last week's levels. Nuwara Eliya's - Select invoices sold well following quality, whilst the others were irregular and easier. Uda Pussellawa's were barely steady. Uva's were Rs. 20-40 per kg easier.

OP/OPA

Well-made varieties were firm to irregularly easier by Rs. 20-50 per kg, whilst the others were firm on last week's levels. The poorer sorts declined by Rs. 30-50 per kg.

PEKOE/PEKOE1

Flavoury PEK's were firm to easier, whilst the Orthodox Leafy PEK's were irregularly easier.PEK1's were firm to dearer by Rs. 30-50 per kg. A few select Best Rotovane PEK's gained byRs. 50-100 per kg following special inquiry, whilst the balance gained to a lesser extent following quality.
