Quality

A select range of Westerns showed a further improvement, whilst the others together with the Nuwara Eliyas were maintained. Uva/Uda Pussellawas and the Low Growns were similar to last.

COMMENTS

Auction offerings declined to 5.6 M/Kgs. There was fair demand.

Ex-Estate offerings were similar to last and totalled 0.9 M/Kgs. Overall quality of Westerns showed a further improvement and a wider selection of improved teas as well.

In the Best Western category, improved BOP's appreciated by Rs. 50 per kg with a few select invoices appreciating up to Rs. 100 per kg, whilst the others continued to be irregular following quality. Corresponding BOPF's appreciated by Rs. 100 per kg and more for select invoices following quality/special inquiry, whilst the others continued to be irregular following quality. In the Below Best category, improved BOP/BOPF's appreciated by Rs. 50 per kg and more for select invoices. Prices at the lower end of the market were firm to marginally dearer for the clean leaf teas, whilst the poor leaf types were neglected. Nuwara Eliya BOP/BOPF's sold well at firm to dearer rates with the latter, in particular, recording price gains of Rs. 50-100 per kg. Uva/Uda Pussellawa BOP's were generally firm. Corresponding BOPF's - Uda Pussellawa's were barely steady. Uva's - Clean leaf types were marginally dearer, whilst the poorer sorts were irregular and easier. Consequently, the clean leaf teas realised a premium of Rs. 100-150 per kg vis-à-vis their poorer counterparts.

In general, BOPF's continued to command a premium in most instances, ironically even in the Best Western category as well.

CTC teas showed no significant change in the overall price structure.

Selective interest from shippers to the UK, Japan and the continent. Fair activity from shippers to South Africa and Hong Kong for select invoices, whilst shippers to the CIS continued to operate in the usual manner.

Low Growns comprised of 2.5 M/Kgs. Leafy, Semi-Leafy and Tippy categories met with fair demand, whilst the Premium category met with good demand. There was improved activity from shippers to Iran.

In the Leafy and Semi-Leafy catalogues, BOP1's in general were easier. Well-made OP1's were lower, whilst the balance sold around last levels. A selection of high-priced OP's appreciated, whilst the balance were easier. Well-made OP/OPA's appreciated, whilst the balance were lower. Select Best PEK's eased, whilst the cleaner Below Best were firm. Balance together with the mixed/open varieties declined. However, teas at the bottom were firm. Well-made PEK's were firm to selectively dearer, whilst the balance were easier. Teas at the bottom were fully firm.

In the Tippy catalogue, well-made FBOP's together with improved Below Best were firm, whilst the balance were irregular. However, teas at the bottom appreciated. Well-made FF1's together with cleaner Below Best appreciated, whilst the balance were firm. Teas at the bottom appreciated.

In the Premium catalogue, Very Tippy teas met with good demand and were dearer. Best and Below Best together with cleaner teas at the bottom too appreciated, whilst the balance were sold around last levels.

In the Below Best category too, a few select improved invoices appreciated by Rs. 50-100 per kg, whilst the others continued to sell around last week's levels. Plainer sorts were firm to marginally dearer. Nuwara Eliya's continued to sell well around last week's levels. Uva/Uda Pussellawa's were generally firm. Best Western's gained by Rs. 100 per kg and more for select invoices following quality/special inquiry, whilst the BOPF others were firm and dearer to a lesser extent. Improved teas in the Below Best category gained by Rs. 50 per kg and more following quality, whilst the others sold around last week's levels. Plainer clean leaf teas were Rs. 20 per kg dearer, whilst the others were barely steady. Nuwara Eliya's - Select invoices gained by up to Rs. 100 per kg, whilst the others sold around last week's levels. Uda Pussellawa's were barely steady. Uva's - Clean leaf types were firm to marginally dearer, whilst the poorer sorts were irregularly easier and at times were unsold. OP/OPA - In general were firm on last levels. **OP/OPA** Flavoury PEK's were firm to dearer, whilst the Orthodox Leafy PEK/PEK1' followed a similar trend. A few select Best **PEKOE/PEKOE1** Rotovane PEK's gained by Rs. 50 per kg following special inquiry, whilst the balance were irregular following quality. Others and poorer sorts were barely steady. Flavoury FBOP's were firm on last levels. Orthodox Leafy FBOP's and well-made FBOPF1s were firm on last levels, **FBOP/FBOPF1** whilst Below Best FBOPF1's declined by Rs. 50 per kg. Teas at the lower end were selectively dearer.

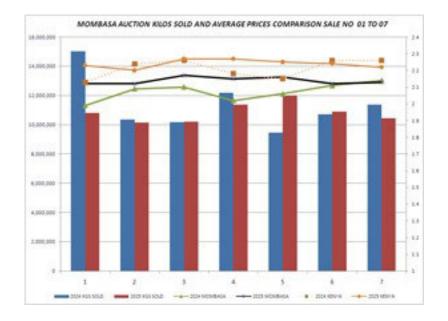
